We will also learn the story of <i>Katie Morag</i><br>Delivers the Mail using Talk 4 Writing to retell the story with<br>words and actions.   | In this half-term, we will think about the world we live in,<br>our weather, the seasons, and the wider United Kingdom.<br>We will study the countries which comprise the UK and<br>their respective capital cities, looking at culture, history,<br>national symbols, and most importantly, food!<br>As digitally literate children, we will be<br>developing our understanding of algorithms<br>and will start to programme Bee-Bot robots<br>using simple commands and sequences of<br>commands. | As responsible and socially aware children,<br>we will focus on collaborative skills to<br>ensure that we develop the skills necessary<br>to work together. We will also work on<br>identifying and valuing our own strengths, gifts and<br>talents and to understand how these, along with<br>others' skills and strengths can contribute to the<br>success of a group task.   |
| As scientists, we will focus on the weather, from both<br>a geographical and scientific perspective. We will<br>describe different weathers, and compare the<br>weather that we see now to that at other times of the year. We<br>will build our own weather gauges (rain gauges), and record our<br>observations and results.  | As artists, the children are introduced to<br>the work of the Impressionists through the<br>book 'Katie Meets the Impressionists' by<br>James Mayhew. They will learn to describe<br>what they see and express their opinions before exploring<br>using a range of tools then making their own 'Impressionist'<br>pictures of winter landscapes.  | As theologians and philosophers, we will be<br>exploring different places of worship such as<br>churches and mosques. We will learn about<br>the special features of places of worship and begin to<br>think about places which are special to us as<br>individuals.  |
| As sports people, we will explore and refine our<br>running skills, agility, balance and coordination during<br>our multi-skills unit. In outdoor PE, we will be<br>continuing to develop our coordination skills through<br>our dance unit. We will be moving in a controlled manner in<br>different speeds and directions inspired by the weather.  | As musicians, we will learn to recognise that<br>there are different styles of music and to<br>express feelings about different pieces of<br>music.
